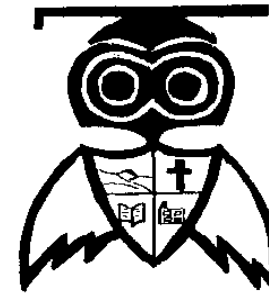


How you can help your child:

Information about our theme

This term is all about journeys. We will be following the journey of the Anglo Saxons as they crossed land and sea to invade Britain. We will be journeying through space and finding out about our solar system and the relationship between the sun, earth and moon. Exploring regions on planet earth and thinking what it would be like to live on a space station...would you take that journey? Eagles will also be learning about the changes we go through on the journey from birth to old age, including puberty and the difference between each stage of development. We will be carrying on with our whole school character education to help us focus on developing virtues as we journey through our own lives. So buckle up it may be a bumpy ride!

Art/Design Technology/Music

We will be:

- Building an Anglo-Saxon village together as a learning log challenge.
- Baking Anglo-Saxon bread and cooking mushroom soup and baked apple.
- Use sketch books to record observations and use them to review and revisit ideas.
- Develop mastery of art and design techniques including drawing, painting and sculpture within a range of materials.
- Listening to contrasting music styles that have been influenced by journeys.
- Developing an understanding of the history of music from the 1950's onwards
- Making and using an Anglo Saxon loom frame for weaving.



Maths We will be learning to:

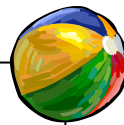
- Read, write, order, calculate and compare numbers to at least 1,000,000 and determine the value of each digit
- Use rounding to check answers to calculations in the context of a problem.
- To count forwards and backwards through zero and use negative numbers.
- Multiply numbers up to 4 digits by a 1- or 2-digit number using a formal written method, including long multiplication for 2-digit numbers
- Use all four operations to solve problems involving measure [for example, length, mass, volume, money] using decimal notation, including scaling.



Physical Development

We will be:

- Learning, practicing and using the skills required in invasion games.
- Acknowledging the need to support and encourage team members.



Knowledge and Understanding of the World

R.E/PHSE

We will be learning about character education and how to develop positive virtues

Geography/History

We will be:

- Using maps, atlases, globes and plotting 4 figure grid references.
- Learning to observe, measure and record information outdoors.
- Looking at Anglo-Saxon settlements, invasions and kingdoms.
- Learning about Anglo-Saxon place names, village life, art and culture.
- Using our geographical and historical enquiry techniques to complete a study of a place of interest in the UK.
- Taking part in 'European day of Languages' in our house groups.

Computing

We will be:

- Learning how to sequence, select and repeat in programmes.



English

We will be learning to:

- Write legibly, fluently and with increasing speed and stamina.
- Use a thesaurus and dictionary to support independent learning.
- Select appropriate grammar and vocabulary, understanding how such choices can change and enhance meaning
- Proof-read for spelling and punctuation errors and learning to edit our own work.
- Write creative extended pieces of writing as an Anglo Saxon, describing your journey.
- Writing biographies about women who made famous journeys.
- Write narrative poems, using the story of Beowulf as our inspiration.
