<u>Maths</u>



We will be:

- Becoming fluent with our multiplication and division facts, particularly focusing on X7 X8 X9 and X12.
- Being proficient in all four operations including long division.
- Reasoning with number and solving problems.
- Adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing fractions.
- Finding fractions of amounts, simplifying fractions and ordering them.
- Using decimals and percentages.
- Interpreting statistics eg pie charts and line graphs.
- Understanding how to use ratio.
- Identifying common factors, square numbers, prime numbers and multiples.

Physical Development



We will be:

- Working with PAS to improve our rounder's skills.
- Being inspired by the music that tells stories eg Swan lake, Romeo and Juliet etc. Then using the stories to create our own dances to tell these stories.
- Creating our own stories through the use of dance.

- Reading different stories from around the world but particularly Folklore of North America and Native Australia (DreamTime).
- Looking at blurbs, book covers and other tools that authors use.
- Making books using different book art techniques.
- Looking at different types of stories and writing our own in a particular style.
- Discussing favorite authors and books. Creating a book display.
- Being accurate with our punctuation, aiming to us colons and semi colons in particular.
- Expanding our vocabulary through guided reading and writing activities.
- Practicing our spelling rules and the common spellings.

<u>Science</u>

We will be:

- Learning about the human body, in particular the circulatory and digestive systems. As well as revisiting the parts of the skeleton.
