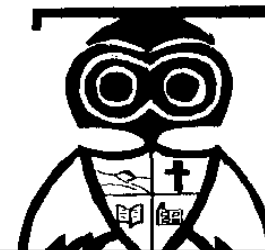


How you can help your child:

CONTRASTS



Information about our theme

This term is all about contrasts. We will be finding out about the differences in lifestyles between the Anglo-Saxons and modern day and exploring the contrasting qualities of food between the rich and the poor of that time (be prepared they may bring some home for you to try). We will be exploring space and thinking about where we fit in the great big solar system and the contrasting atmospheres on the planets.

Eagles will also be learning about the changes we go through from birth to old age, including puberty and the difference between each stage of development.

We will be experiencing live theatre in school and learning about character education to help us focus on developing virtues.

Art/Design Technology/Music We will be:

- Building an Anglo-Saxon village together as a learning log challenge.
- Looking at seasonally grown food in the Anglo-Saxon era and baking Anglo-Saxon bread.
- Use sketch books to record observations and use them to review and revisit ideas.
- Develop mastery of art and design techniques including drawing, painting and sculpture within a range of materials.
- Listening to a timeline of influential and contrasting music styles.
- Developing an understanding of the history of music.



Maths We will be learning to:

- Read, write, order, calculate and compare numbers to at least 1,000,000 and determine the value of each digit
- Use rounding to check answers to calculations and determine, in the context of a problem, levels of accuracy.
- Add amounts of money using column addition; Use rounding to check answers.
- Multiply numbers up to 4 digits by a 1- or 2-digit number using a formal written method, including long multiplication for 2-digit numbers
- Use all four operations to solve problems involving measure [for example, length, mass, volume, money] using decimal notation, including scaling.



English We will be learning to:

- Write legibly, fluently and with increasing speed and stamina.
- Use a thesaurus and dictionary to support independent learning.
- Using drama to develop characters from Anglo-Saxon time: writing expanded noun phrases to describe and bring to life the characters.
- Select appropriate grammar and vocabulary, understanding how such choices can change and enhance meaning
- Proof-read for spelling and punctuation errors and learning to edit our own work.
- Write creative extended pieces of writing travelling through time and space
- Appreciate and engage with live theatre in school



Knowledge and Understanding of the World

We will be learning about character education and how to develop positive virtues
As usual in this term we will also be engaging with activities in anti-bullying week.
We will be exploring holy books and exploring those difficult questions about religion.



Geography/History

We will be:

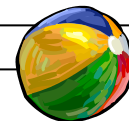
- Using maps, atlases and globes, digital and computer mapping.

- Using our geographical and historical enquiry techniques to complete a study of a place of interest in the house groups.
- Taking part in 'European day of Languages' in our house groups.
