How you can help your child:

Sharing books together and helping your child to learn the phase 2 and 3 tricky words in context, (these are on the bookmarks sent home at the beginning of the year.)
Encouraging your child to segment and blend words orally so that they can confidently distinguish the sounds in words.

Asking 'how' and 'why' questions as you share books with your child.

Talking with your child about the things they see whilst out and about and encouraging them to look for numbers and shapes around them.

Helping them to count on and back from different numbers within twenty.

Please continue to let us know of anything significant that your child does at home. Please use stars or post it notes to write down their achievements dating and signing them. Your child can then stick these into their learning journeys.
