Information about our theme

As the theme suggests this term is all about stories. Eagles will be learning about the story of the Ancient Greeks and their influence on the world today. Maths We will be learning to:

- Solve number problems and practical problems involving place value.

- Identify prime numbers up to 100 and know primes up to 19; understand the vocabulary of prime and composite numbers; identify prime factors.
- Identify, name and write equivalent fractions; reduce fractions to simplest form, including tenths to fifths, hundredths to tenths.

We will be learning to:

- Select appropriate grammar and vocabulary, understanding how such choices can change and enhance meaning
- Write legibly, fluently and with increasing speed.
- Proof-read for spelling and punctuation errors
- Write in the style of a classic author-imagine you have found your own wardrobe.
- Write a detailed description on a given theme, what did Edmund see when he reached the witches castle?
- Design an advert for Turkish Delight using persuasive writing.
- Use modal verbs or adverbs to indicate degrees of possibility.
